Thanks to kindness like yours, Emily's Hope has been able to extend help to 215 individuals battling addiction through our Emily's Hope Treatment Scholarships at the Avera Addiction Care Center. Furthermore, we are proud to announce that our Substance Use Prevention Curriculum is now implemented in schools across four states and one foreign country. With your help, we can continue this invaluable work, giving children and teenagers the tools they need to resist the lure of substance abuse.

Our reach has also expanded to offering a lifeline for those grieving from overdose and fentanyl poisoning with our support group. Additionally, we have launched a Post-Overdose Response Team to respond to overdose survivors in Minnehaha and Lincoln Counties, ensuring they receive the help they need. Your contribution is essential in providing this much-needed support for people who have lost a loved one to this tragedy and those who survive an overdose.

These initiatives, and our broader mission, were born from a deep personal loss. After my 21-year-old daughter, Emily, died from fentanyl poisoning, I established Emily's Hope to ensure no other family has to endure the heartbreak her family has faced.
